PROGRAMME DETAILS 2016

Thursday 06 October, 6 for 6.15 pm. Musical Evening with Buffet at the Ambassador's Residence.

The Society is delighted that ambassador, Mona Juul, is able to continue the tradition of hosting a Musical Evening at the Residence. We will start with pre-concert drinks at **6.00** for **6.15 pm**. Ingunn Tennøe who graduated from The Norwegian Academy of Music with a master's degree in classical piano in 2014, will provide the musical entertainment followed by a buffet reception lasting till **9 pm**. We are asking members to contribute **£ 15** per person, which is not refundable, towards the cost of the concert.

Thursday 27 October, 6 pm, AGM followed by an illustrated talk; "The Fresco Epoch in Norwegian Art 1918-1950" by Dr Marie Wells.

Between 1918 and 1950 there was a sudden burst of public art, mainly in Oslo, which started with the Stock Exchange in Bergen and culminated in the decorations in Oslo City Hall, and nearly all the work was carried out by three young artists, Axel Revold, Per Krohg, and Alf Rolfsen who had all studied in Paris and adopted fresco as their medium for decorating public spaces. This lecture will cover the challenges they faced and the vast range of their output, with many images from places which today are not readily accessible to the public.

This Norwegian-Irish co-production is the first English language film from the Norwegian director Eric Poppe. The main character, Rebecca, played by Juliette Binoche, is one of the world's top war photographers. Following a female suicide bomber in Kabul, she takes a big risk and is seriously wounded. Waking up in hospital, she must weather a major emotional storm when her husband refuses to put up with her dangerous life any longer. He and their young daughters need Rebecca, who, however, loves both her family and her work

The film was voted best Norwegian film when released.
